a. There are a lot of places listed, but where can you find *Nolan*?

b. Famous market and famous cookies

c. Go to Berger's Cookies at Lexington Market

2. Historical clue

- a. The current park has the same name as the man who lived in the house, as does one of the names of the Civil War camps

- b. Check out Carroll Park

- c. Go to Mount Clare historic house in Carroll Park

3. Tile puzzles

a. We can help you eliminate one of several options in a puzzle [5 min penalty]

b. Answer to one of the puzzles [10 min penalty]

1. This is a magic square, meaning what each of the rows and each column adds up to the same number. It's H (not M) because H has the right font.
2. I because of its dark border and its shape
3. P because it has the right number of dots and the angle opens to the left
4. P because there is a square in every tile, but only two of each of the other shapes in each row. This tile is missing the hexagon and the circle.
5. O because the two shapes are sliding past one another across the row creating the third shape
6. D because the squares add, and the circles only show up in the last tile if it is in that position in both of the first tiles
7. R because the shapes in the first two tiles add to one another to form the last tile
8. O because the first column tile is sequential with the last column (e.g. first row: S – T, second row: O – N, third row: E - _)
9. M because well, actually, we don't know, something about the reflection and rotation of the letters. What can we say; we got these out of a mensa book and apparently we aren't in the top 1 percentile of mensa people.
10. E because the row pattern is {square, half-filled oval, filled oval} where apparently the content of the square carries over into the last column.
